FOUNDER's NOTE

Indeed, was this year one like none before! The sudden new situation of the COVID19 Pandemic has derailed many things globally and has brought for some tremendous challenges to deal with. Many lost their job and income and got near to (and over) the edge of existence while others were able to expand, start new companies to make even



more profit. We don't need to emphasize much to understand that the ones who suffered the most were those with instable livelihood, and that justice around the world to equalize will be challenged. The leap towards humanity from various governments was partly great, for some only on paper but left unimplemented and far from reality.

While our team was reaching out to the needy, hungry, and lonely who are connected to our projects and range of villages, with emergency relief efforts, we also needed to adjust, or redefine our method and process of work and to manage and process the huge amount of information, not all useful, but a many misleading, confusing and even depressing added another challenge. EDUCATION DURING PANDEMIC

It was an unexpected change of events when the news of Corona Virus Disease (COVID 19) broke out and the total lockdown implemented by the Government from end of March 2020. Schools were asked to close abruptly not knowing the way forward for students but asked to promote every student to the next class without exams.

OUR SCHOOL AND PANDEMIC EFFECTS

Our school is situated in a rural area with existing challenges likelimited transportation, inadequate internet service, not many learned people, and least importance for education. It becamemore challenging for us to reach our students for learning and teaching purpose. Parents were constantly challenged by various crisis uch as the following...

- Loss of job or businesses
- Lack of access to basic needs
- Financial situation
- Lack of learned people to help
- Interpretation of the task
- Avoided school in fear of paying fees

As the government faced the problem of continuing teaching their students due to lack of technology-based teaching, their strategy of providing basic needs of groceries and food, attracted other parents of private school students to them. We had encountered losing our students as well like any other private schools in the state. We had come to know about their joining in government schools when we noticed them being removed from our online government portal for students reduced drastically from 104 to 81.

COPING WITH THE CHALLENGE

It was not easy to even think about managing students outside the boundaries of a school for a period unknown. Yet, we had to strategize the plan what, how, when, and where.

REACHING OUT TO OUR STUDENTS

Our Teaching team worked on the learning materials to be sent to our students' houses as the schools were shut. However, we were skeptical about how much support the student will receive from their parents. We were not in a position to ask parents to purchase mobile phones for their children since almost 30 of them lost their jobs, 10 lost their small business and face other challenges of not receiving wages.

Even if they had mobile phones, we faced challenges as follows:

- Minimal response from parents' side when activities were sent through mobile phone
- Students did not complete one kit within a week. Many students were taking more than two weeks to complete.
- We could not be there to help those students who were struggling to understand the concept. Specifically, younger students could not understand even when we explained clearly through calls.
- At times, it was difficult to evaluate the completed works of students as we were not sure if the work was done by the student or someone else.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR - Academic

Do It & Post It (DIPI) – Academic Activity

As the heading goes, learning activity kits were prepared for the benefit of the students during COVID pandemic situation to 'do it' and 'post it'. It was a mode of educating students beyond the digital platform accommodating everyone without socio-economic barriers and to utilize the time equipping our staff for conceptual teaching strategy.

• Purpose towards students:

- Teaching students to be productive
- Bridging the gaps in learning, during pandemic
- Providing opportunity to learn during pandemic in a fair way

• Purpose towards staff and Parents:

- Training our staff on adapting the concept-based learning into our curriculum
- Changing the perspective of staff, parents to understand the need of the students to learn from their home
- Hands on training for staff to prepare and present a concept as well as theage-appropriate content

• Concept:

- Activity kits for the students wereprepared and packed
- The kits were then taken to the villages by our representative
- Every student received the activity kit from the representative who distributed
- Finally, the completed activities kits will be collected by our representative and brought to ourteachers

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR - Non Academic

Little Farmer and Recycled Products

These activities were environmental based to create an interest to ponder 'even I can grow plants' and 'I can reuse the waste'. Students were given an activity to grow micro-greens using seeds available in their houses and learned how to maintain the plants. Many students actively participated in the activity. As part of the environmental activity our students recycled materials for creating various products.







Superhero Activity

Students were given another activity 'Superhero' to learn and teach their neighbors, friends and family about how to keep themselves safe from the corona virus. They learned the importance of using the mask to protect from the virus and refrain from spreading to others. They dressed like their choice of superhero and clicked pictures. It was an effective activity that students participated with much enthusiasm. This activity was initiated, prepared by Mr. Jonah Chellappa. He had prepared a Superhero Activity Guide with practical Do It Yourself activities to stimulate the interest in young students to swiftly act in protecting themselves and others.



Know Your Students (KYS)

There had been a few students who could not participate in the activities. Hence, we decided to conduct a door-to-door survey to study the conditions of our parents and the challenges they had in involving their children in learning. The survey questions included the financial situation, job condition, etc. We had a good response post survey, and a few parents supported their children in participating in the activity. We were able to understand the following conditions that the parents went through during the pandemic and many more.



- The type of mobile phone available with them to send appropriate data
- The impact of the pandemic in their day today life
- Any medical complication occurred in the recent past
- Level of participation and involvement of the parent to support the child with learning
- Consent of parents to meet the children in their own village
- Feedback and suggestion from parents regarding the learning activity

INTRODUCTION

One of the main focuses of Karunakarya is to develop the children in our communities as they are the future of our communities and our nation in larger context. And if the children in the communities change positively, then the entire community changes in the future. We run **Evening Learning Centres** in the communities we work where we do academic activities, special events and also Child Parliament. We have expanded to two more places this year.

EVENING LEARNING CENTER (ELC)

is a hub for developmental activities and exposures, where the children from various under privileged communities come together to learn and develop their skills. At present we have seven Evening Learning Centres with twelve facilitators.

FOCUS OF THE YEAR

This year was unpredictable for everyone, as most of us faced pandemic for the first time in life. With majority of the beneficiaries lost their job or given unpaid leave, the lockdown was a severe hit to the livelihood of the beneficiaries. Children were frustrated by being at home all the time and could not meet their friends. Many beneficiaries' children did not have access to smart phone for online classes.

We decided to contact children through their parents mobile and give activities during the rigorous lockdown. And after few restrictions were withdrawn the facilitators started visiting the children at their respective home and met them outside and taught them from modules and also other activities to increase their literacy level.

Children and parents started requesting our facilitators during the house visits to reopen ELC and they are eager to come back and learn. When restrictions were withdrawn in few places children were allowed to come to the ELC (Lockdown Activity Centre) on rotational basis with the consent of the parents and in some places they were made as small groups in the neighbourhood and taught. Also Child Parliament was initiated again in the end of the year. ELC was started at Nattarasanpet and Kulangalacherry in the end of the year.

CHALLENGES:

Access to children during lockdown : During the pandemic situation giving activities and meeting the children were really challenging. As we had to shut down the ELC building and changed the way of approach. Initially during the full lockdown when we taught the children through the parent's mobile phones, we could not reach to the students who did not have mobile phones at their home.

Time Consuming Home Visits: It was time consuming for facilitators to visit all the children at their home individually and teach assessment or give activities. In some village the distance between the houses of the students are more. Hence the frequency of their visit was less and the children missed them and also missed coming to ELC. Due to the long gap children were also finding it difficult to read and write.

Remote & Unsafe Locations: For instance in Arambakkam the facilitator faced challenges of snakes and dogs while visiting the children in their houses. Also there is no street light or proper road in the village. There is a wine shop near the village and people are drinking in the daylight in public places too. Hence it was not very safe for the facilitator.

Long Time Lapse between visits: Our Eraiyur center re-opened on 6th October2020, only minimum students came with the consent of their parents and we faced challenges in meeting the remaining students on Saturdays, who were not permitted and regular because of Covid-19. If the facilitator visits one batch of students on Saturday, it takes long gap to meet them again, so the students faced difficulties to recollect the things which were taught by the facilitator last time. So the progress of learning from modules was very slow.

Masking and Social Distancing: Children found it very difficult to maintain proper social distancing and to wear face mask regularly. To ensure maintaining social distancing we segregated children into batches to come to the center once a week. Each batch is alotted a specific day but sometimes the students get confused arriving on the wrong day making it difficult to manage. Child Parliament stopped because of the pandemic, but kick started again in the end of the year. Due to the long gap, children needed to be trained from the beginning.



CHILDREN ENGAGING IN ELC WORK DURING THE YEAR

ELC ACTIVITIES : SOME HIGHLIGHTS

This year we started ELC (Lockdown Activity Centre) in Nattarasanpet and Kulangalacherry. Altogether we are having seven ELCs at Eraiyur, Gunduperumbedu, Navalur 1, Navalur 2, Arambakkam, Nattarasanpet and Kulangalacherry with total of 278 children of which 131 are boys and 147 are girls. This year four facilitators Kiruthika, Jayamalini, Praisi and Maithili joined newly and two facilitators Swetha and Divya left the job due to personal reasons.

One of the key objectives of the ELC is to improve the literacy and numerical skills up to their expected level according to their age. Modules were implemented to the children throughout the year. During the lockdown children were taught from Modules at home itself and after the restrictions were relaxed they were taught from Modules at the ELC (Lockdown activity centre). This schedule allowed facilitators to meet the children only once in a week or once in two weeks. Still, many students were doing their activity sincerely and even few parents actively participated along with their children.



World Day Against Trafficking in Persons

World Day against trafficking in Persons was also observed n July. On that day the staff showed some meaningful picture about trafficking and the staff made the children to answer some of the children to answer some of the questions related to that. It was heartening to hear from children that they will be brave enough to call the police or some will get help from the elders around them if the situation happens to them. We are happy that one of our 2nd std student was able to recollect the story of past year related to this trafficking which we shared.

Observation of Week of Love:



Week of love was observed to develop the character of Loving the parents, friends, siblings, teachers, strangers and poor among children. It was observed during the Valentine's Day week to make the children understand true love and have a positive view on the day. The children made cards with loving quotes and gave it to their parents and siblings who were happy and overwhelmed. This improved emotional bonding between them. We created awareness on the theme, "love others as you love yourself". Children also showed their love towards nature by planting small saplings and watering them daily around their home.

Awareness regarding Bonded Labour System

Bonded labour system still exists in some northern districts of Tamil Nadu. It is one of the worst practices through which vulnerable people are oppressed and exploited for decades. On the Day Against Bonded Labour System, the children were given awareness on this social evil. We also spoke about how to respond when we find anyone being a bonded labourer.



Independence Day Contest

The home based Independence Day Contest was organised between 17.08.2020 - 19.08.2020 on the theme "Covid-19 vs India". 47 teens and 35 children between 6 years – 21 years from Eraiyur, Navalur, Arambakkam Gunduperumbedu and participated. Four

competitions conducted namely elocution, poetry, essay writing and drawing were conducted. The participants could participate in any three. Children did their work and submitted to the facilitators during house visits, elocution were video recorded and then evaluated. The competition was tough and the children expressed their view of India's response to Covid-19 well. Gifts were distributed to the winners and certificates were given to all the participants.

Online group sessions by Social Work Trainees


The Social Work trainees from Madras Christian College organised online sessions for the children on Effective use of time and another session on Social Media and how to use their mobile phones properly. The sessions had games and interactive activities to ensure the children are kept attentive. It was a new experience for our students and they wanted more sessions.



One of our student Natheen who was very low in his studies so his mother made him to join in our ELC at first we started teaching him we came to know that he was even struggling in basic letters also. So day by day we took special care on him and finally now he is well improved he can write basic letters on his own and his mother gave good feedback that he was better than before and also he was disobeying his mother and he used to use vulgar words to everyone, so his mom worried a lot and conveyed to our facilitator. The facilitator started taking steps to change him and gave counseling to him. Few days later when the facilitator visited his mother and asked about his behaviour his mother told that he changed and good now.



Another of our 8th std students Epshibha told that by coming to ELC that she can able to learn many new things like observing important days on every month and many new craft activities and in lockdown days she forgot many things As we went and started to implement modules for them that time it is very easy for her to recollect everything that she had studied before .as a whole she feel it's a good place for her to grow in a good manner.

Leema Rose, motherof Vaishnavi said that when she taught her child she didn't understand, but when the facilitator taught it, she understood it as we teach it through some activities. Arambakkam

Thenmozhi, mother of Sugumar was concerned as her son was not even knew how to study, but now after teaching him modules, he is able to study to some extent by adding the words. Arambakkam

Jeni 9th standard from Eraiyur was very much interested in grammer and requested the facilitator to take some more sessions, which the facilitator took. One day she came and told that in her class when his teacher was taking grammar class, no one knew the answer except her, so she got appreciation from the respective staff in the whole class. And also, she spoke about a topic in teens club, that time her speech was well and good. By seeing her others who were watching got motivated and they also gave speech on their own later.

FACILITATOR'S TRAINING AND STAFF MEETINGS:

Facilitators met together once in a month at Eraiyur campus to review the current month and plan for the upcoming month. This year was an unusual year due to pandemic, so we couldn't meet every month. But the facilitator attended webinars during the lockdown days and also had two trainings in campus.

A training on basic counseling skills and communication:

This training was organized for the facilitators on 26.10.2020. The first session was on basic counseling skills which was taken by Billy Coordinator. The definition, basics in counseling, who need counseling, qualities of a counselor, principles of counseling, stages of counseling with live examples were covered during the session. The next session on Communication which was earlier conducted before lockdown and the second session was taken now, by Paul, Coordinator. In the session the facilitators were motivated that they can improve their communication skills if they work on some basic things. Writing skills in a language, reading skills in a language, pronunciation were covered during the session. How to develop the ability to read and write in English was also taught.



I learned about basics of counseling, aim of counseling and also communication how to communicate with others easily, I can apply in my work place – Rekha We realised we could have spoken to the girls little better, but now we relaised we will reach out to them, those who are in need better. Through communication session I got confident that even we can write. - Nancy

Training on Child Parliament and Youth club:

The training on Child Parliament and youth clubwas facilitated by the Coordinators as two sessions on 23.01.2021 and 27.02.2021. The session started with a small documentary on a successful Child Parliament in a small village near Tiruvallur. Then the facilitators were asked to share their experiences from the child clubs which they were handling at their respective ELCs. Then the basic structure of Child Parliament and its functions, Child rights were explained. After

that the facilitators were explained on the district level governance's organizational structure from District Collector to VAO and Panchayat Ward member. They were also explained on the responsibilities of each officers and how the children parliament can approach these officers at different level according to their need. The facilitators shared that the day was useful that they could reflect on their activities so far and could able to identify the current issues in their community and also got an idea to plan for this year. They also share that the session on Child Parliament was informative and they learnt about hierarchy of government under district level and how they can involve child parliament to access the children's welfare from government and ensure child rights in their community.

Students are eager to study and draw now. Students who regularly studying are now improving in their reading. The parents contact the facilitators sometimes for even guiding their children on behavioural and attitude issues - Arambakkam

INTRODUCTION

Our vision is to develop a confident and responsible community with positive world view. For this, it is important to work with the men and women in the community other than the children and youth. We work by organizing activities to create awareness in the community and also to bring an involvement in the development of the community.

This year brought lot of challenges with many restrictions to gather people. Hence we could organize only few Community Engagement Activities this year once the restrictions were relaxed

Pongal Celebrations with Covid-19 awareness:



Pongal is much loved festival and it was celebrated in the community at Navalur and Gunduperumbedu in which 80 people and 120 children participated.

At Gunduperumbedu it was organized on 14th January 2021 at 11 am. Pongal community celebrations included games and a kolam contest for parents and children. The Director addressed the people and also insisted about the importance of taking proper precaution for Covid-19. Outdoor sports were organized for the children categorized based on their age. Covid-19 awareness were given during the program, by distributing awareness pamphlets and explaining about wearing masks. Prizes were given to the winners and Sweet Pongal was distributed to the participants at the end.



At Navalur Pongal Celebrations were organized on

18thJanuary 2021 at 3 pm. Children and staff from other tuition centres run by National Domestic Workers Welfare Trust also participated. Activities were the same as conducted in Navalur. The Director visited the contest and encouraged the participants and also interacted with the people. At the end Sweet Pongal and soap were distributed to the participants.



Women's Day Celebrations:

International Women's Day was observed on 8th March at Eraiyur and 13th March at Gunduperumbedu and Navalur for the women to create an opportunity for the women to cherish the day and feel happy for being woman. The theme for this year's Women's Day Celebration is "Choose to Challenge". Altogether 156 women and 19 children, 3 men from Navalur, Gunduperumbedu and Eraiyur and 15 staff members participated in these programs.

It was designed to be a fun filled day for women - to forget all their worries and enjoy the day. We conducted individual and group games in which the women played with good team spirit. The resource persons addressed the women with a positive note, challenging them to be different and choose to challenge the exploitation and oppression they face in a daily basis. They encouraged them to pursue their dream and be a good wife, mother for their family. Prizes were distributed for winners in the end of each program. In Navalur a souvenir was given to all the participants to encourage them. Refreshments were served to all participants in the end.

Consultation meeting with the Resident Welfare Associations at TNSCB, Navalur



Karunakarya works Resident with the Welfare Associations at TNSCB, Navalur for the development of the community. A consultation meeting with them was organized on 10th August 2020 to discuss with the community leaders about the needs and issues prevalent TNSCB, in Navalur.

The aim was also to find out the possibilities of partnerships to address the issues and needs in the community by approaching the relevant authorities. Seven leaders from the two residential welfare associations and animators of Community Development Department, TNSCB participated in the consultation meeting. It was decided to do a survey about the needs in the community and also to submit a petition to relevant authority by the Resident Welfare Associations. The social workers of Karunakarya spoke to the Panchayat Secretery, Serepenenchery Panchayat and met the Village Administrative officer, Serepenenchery and discussed about the things which were raised during the consultation meeting.

Community Outreach

A community outreach was organized for 9 deserving tribal poor families from Velathancherry, Perinjambakkam and Nalamperumbedu on 16.12.2021. The staff of Karunakarya collected money for the community outreach by having a sale for a week. Pilot visit was made to these communities to do survey and identify the felt need of the people. 9 deserving tribal poor families were chosen for the outreach and it was planned to give a kit per family which includes





one blanket, one bed sheet, cake, Tarpoline for roof, plastic sheets for floor and rope for fixing the tarpoline.

On the evening of 16th December 2020 staff went as three teams for the outreach. Each team went to one area and distributed the kits to the families. The staff had a

gentle chat with the people after giving the kits. The people were very happy to receive the kits and said that in this monsoon and winter these materials will be very useful for them. The staff members who visited the people and distributed the kits were also very pleased and shared that they feel satisfied and content by seeing the people.

Solar lanterns were given to the 20 families who don't have electricity at home on 23rd December 2020, 10th February 2021, 13th& 24th March 2021. Six families from these nine families who received outreach kits, seven families from Gunduperumedu tribal hamlet, one family from Eraiyur, and six more families from Kulanalacherry.

A person named Masilamani was staying alone in our village. On 6th August 2020 he was suffering from epilepsy and he lost his consciousness since 8 pm. After finishing my job, 1 had returned to my home at 6:45 pm, relatives of Masilamni did not take any actions. They were scared to take him out. He screamed with pain between 3 pm to 6 pm it seems, asking for help and finally lost his consciousness. But no one reached out to help him. But I felt that I should do something. Though my mother didn't allow me initially fearing I may get into any trouble I boldly went with my brother and I called Panchayat secretary, VAO and police. At 10 pm police reached the place. They broke the door and entered his house and found him unconscious. The police arranged for a vehicle and admitted him in Government Hospital at 11 pm. Masiliamani recovered now and is back to the village and started working too!. Ezekiel, ELC Facilitator, Gunduperumbedu

In my life I have never done anything like this before. When I visited them I was shocked to see that people are suffering like this even now. I felt very happy while distributing these kits to them. ACHIEVEMENTS & LEARNINGS

- After attending the Pongal celebration in Eraiyur ELC some children took decision that they won't
 be wasting food anymore and they will encourage farmers to cultivate more crops and also they
 will help them with their level of kindness. After some days some students were really helping their
 grandparents in cultivating crops and also they planted many saplings at their homes and some
 student told that they are not wasting food and water anymore.
- By the awareness given by us directly and also through posters in Navalur children were wearing masks while coming out. Earlier the children and people who sit outside the apartment don't wear the mask. But now a considerable percentage of them are wearing mask.
- On the occasion of Independence Day, a contest was organized on the theme "Covid19 vs India". In which 2nd std child Pragathi spoke about Covid saftey on her own in elocution competition. Despite being so small, her progress is good. She has made wonderful use of the opportunity she got through ELC to develop her skill.

MOVING FORWARD...

- Till now we didn't conduct program for men's day in many places. We can organize some programs for men's in all our communities.
- To give exposure to the men and women in the communities on possible livelihood initiatives and implement it on the occasion of 20th year celebration.
- To organize more awareness programs with the women SHGs and NREGA workers in our communities to reach many in our communities

SPONSORSHIPS

Karunakarya reaches to the individual cases where the poorest of the poor is in a hopeless situation. Karunakarya gives medical, educational, other financial or material sponsorships to such deserving people and have brought hope to many such hopeless people in the past. This year we have sponsorships to three cases other than the Covid-19 relief.

MEDICAL SPONSORSHIPS

Re-habilitation: Murugan, 23 years old young man is addicted to drug for the past two years. His father left the family when he was young and his mother took care of him and his two younger brothers by vending flowers at Purasaivakkam. The Covid lockdown disabled her small business and she now works as a sanitary worker at Kilpauk Medical College.

Murugan was addicted to drugs due to an incident in his college and then discontinued his education. His mother has already spent around 2 lakhs for his treatment by taking loans for high interest but his condition hasn't improved. He and his family were living in Patallam near Purasaivakkam, but often Murugan leaves the house and wanders around. Last year he left the house and reached his aunt's house at Navalur which is about 50 kms away after 12 days with wounds and torn clothes. He often gets high on drugs and is a threat to the safety of the family and neighbors.



As the family is helpless, they approached Karunakarya for helping them to admit him in a rehabilitation center. We have admitted him in a good rehabilitation centre at Chennai in the month of September 2020. For the past seven months he is admitted, and we could see some difference in him. Together with his family, we believe that soon Murugan comes out as a different man and live a good life.



Accident Treatment: Malliga is a widow from Navalur who lives with her daughter (school drop-out) and a bedridden son Sakthivel, 30 yrs. Sakthivel met with a bike accident in 2016 at Annanagar, Chennai. Both his hip bones and a bone in right hand were fractured. Initial treatment in traditional bone setting at Puttur, Andhra Pradesh did not work. He was then admitted him to Kilpauk Medical College Hospital, Chennai where they treated him for many months. After going through two surgeries two plates were kept in both the hips. Sakthivel had to be on bed even after surgeries and he could not sit or stand. Sadly his house in the bank of Koovam River built in encroachment land in Annanagar was destroyed by the government in post Tamil Nadu flood 2015 disaster preparedness. Hence they were allotted a house in TNSCB, Navalur. As they could not afford better treatment, Sakthivel was bedridden and stopped taking tablets since the Covid-19 lockdown. Malliga requested The Director, Karunakarya for helping her son on his treatment. Karunakarya decided to help provide treatment and admitted him at SRM Medical College Hospital and Research Centre, Kattankulathur in the mid March 2021. When we admitted Sakthivel, he used to be only lying down on bed, but now he is able to sit on bed and move to wheel chair by himself.

Long Term Treatment:

Vijayanathan is a young man from Kuppam, Thiruvanmaiyur affected by skin disease. He is living with his aged parents. His father is working as a security. Vetri is working with Karuna Creations thrice a week. He needs to apply lotion all over his body which costs him more. Hence Karunakarya helped him regularly to buy his medicines for skin and eyes.

Amaravathi is an old woman who was working with Karunakarya as maintenance staff. She lost her husband long back and has been taking care of her two grandchildren who lost their parents. Karunakarya helps regularly to buy her regular medicines for diabetes and BP.

MATERIAL SPONSORSHIP

Bharath 8th std and Elavarasi 7th std are siblings from Gunduperumbedu who are part of the Evening Learning Centre and the Skill Development programs of Karunkarya. Bharath's father was an alcoholic and used to always beat his mother. Whenever his father beats his mother, Bharath tries to stop it, but ends up getting beaten too. His mother is a home maker and also works in NREGA 100 days employment program by the government. Bharath's father died suddenly because of stomach pain in the end of January 2021. The sudden death of his father shattered the whole family and they are hopeless about the future. Just two days before he died his father burnt all the clothes of Bharath, Elavarasi and their mother on the night of Bhogi. Hence they are not having proper clothes too. They recently built a simple house with hollow blocks, and cement sheet roof, but it does not have a door. As of now they are using saree to hide at the entrance. Bharath's mother requested Karunakarya to help them to put a door. Karunakarya helped the family with main door. Karunakarya also collected and gave old usable cloths and necessary household things.

EDUCATIONAL SPONSORSHIP

Vikram is a young vibrant boy pursuing his under graduation in Physics. Vikram's father is a Inverter and Solar service technician and mother is a home maker. Vikram is extending his knowledge to the 12th grade students from neighborhood. He takes free Physics tuition for them in evenings. Due to the online classes and project work, seminar he needs a Laptop. But due to his family situation they are unable to afford the same. His father approached Karunakarya for helping them to get a laptop forVikram. Karunakarya provided a laptop for Vikram on 25th January 2021. Vikram is interested to pursue his higer education in research field.



EDUCATIONAL SPONSORSHIP OF COMMUNITY (STAFF CHILDREN)

Children of our staff who belong to the local community are receiving sponsorship under ur organisational policy. Karunkarya identified nine staff children who study in private schools and also TAPS run by Karunakarya. Karunakarya paid fees for six students who are studying in private schools. Among which three children's fees were partially paid as per policy. Three children who are studying in TAPS were given full subsidy in school fees as per policy. Totaly nine children were benefited.



TESTIMONIES, STORIES AND EXPERIENCES

Sakthivel's mother with tears in her eyes thanked us by saying, "Thank you so much for taking so much effort for the treatment of my son. It is really painful to see my son who was walking all fine from childhood suddenly bedridden after accident four years before, and I wondered how his rest of the life is going to be. But by the help of God you have stepped in, I'm really thankful. Malliga, Navalur

Murugan's mother with tears in her eyes thanked us by saying, "I have faced lot of challenges all my life, after my husband left us, I had to sell flowers, work hard and take care of my three sons. And because of all of them I'm facing challenges now. Especially because of Murugan all my peace, money aregone. Because of his addiction our respect in the neighbourhood, peace with them, and spent about Rs.2 lakhs for his treatment which was taken as loan from people. Thank you so much for choosing to help Murugan by admitting him in rehabilitation centre to come out from his addiction. Lakshmi, Navalur

Always I faced abuses and problems because of my alcoholic husband when he was alive, even few days before he died, he burn all our dresses and there is nothing in our house for us to wear other than what we are wearing now, not even inners for my children. Even we don't have proper electric connection at home and also we don't have a door for the house. Thank you so much for considering us and helping us with door, old clothes, household kitchen necessities for us. It is really helpful.

INTRODUCTION

Everyone could be a leader in their own arena like family, community, institution and society they are in. When everyone is inspired and guided to take initiatives by focusing on right values, there will be a positive change around them. In that sense we continued our works, though the situation during the year was different because of the pandemic.

The target for the year was to support the mental and physical well-being of the communities around us during the spread of the pandemic, lockdown and allied problems. We also wanted to continue our youth leadership development program and do some welfare activities through the youth groups in the villages. We were not able to conduct our usual Life Skills and Communication skills classes and Career Guidance and Development Program in the Government Schools in our regular working areas of restrictions to gather. Our monthly programs for Skill Development and Personality Development were also paused because of the pandemic.



Yet we were able to plan and offer some programs for teens and youth as follows:

- 12-23 years Lockdown Activities, Talent Contest and Career Preparatory activities
- 13-35 years Leadership Skills

It was different and difficult this year because there was a need to invest our time and efforts in relief materials distribution and creating awareness to reduce the ill-effects of the pandemic and lockdown. Still we were able to reach out to some of the teens and youth in their locations.

Student Interns from Madras Christian College had contributed in some of the programs, for the participants to get some learning experience and different perspectives. We never compromised our core values while planning and executing the programs and it was our guiding force. We respected everyone by accepting the differences. We were fair in reaching out to the people with our maximum capability. We had connected with maximum villages in Padappai - Oragadam - Sriperumbudur stretch, without any partiality or discrimination.

LOCKDOWN ACTIVITIES

It is very difficult to contain the teens and youth inside their homes without engaging them with activities for a long period of time. When the teens and youth are given space to utilize their talents, they learn many more new things by themselves. With this in mind, we gave them lockdown activities to do from home, week after week from April to August 2020. This helped help them to be engaged positively and use their time and talents in a constructive manner.

The objectives of Lockdown activities are

- To utilize the time, talents and treasures properly
- To be positive and have good relationship in the family
- To learn something new or relearn what is already learnt

The following are some of the activities that were given to the beneficiaries during the Lockdown from April to August 2020.

CAREER PREPARTORY ACTIVITIES

With much time in the hands of young people due to the Covid lockdown - we thought it would be a good time to engage them in preparing for career oriented exams. The training was planned keeping in mind various competitive exams.

The List of topics/ concepts that was covered in the

Career Preparatory Activities is as follows.

Methodology: We had provided the content in hardcopy as well as web pages so that they can omplete it in their own place in their own time. Each topic/concept had content to work for at least 1-2 hours, a day for two weeks. The topic/ concept had subtopics or categories and each subtopic had some activities to reflect and do. In the activities or concepts the students were also encouraged to create things by themselves. The link for the web pages were sent through Whatsapp to the beneficiaries contacts in the Database.

Content was made in three levels :-

Level 1: 12-14 years

Level 2: 15-17 years

Level 3: 18years and above.

Follow-up and Post Follow-up: Some participants approached us over phone or while meeting in person for doubts and clarifications. After the two weeks of learning from the activity sheets on a topic/concept, some participants submitted their activity sheets for corrections or further learning.

Certification: A final assessment were taken by some of the participants in Jan 2021 and those who scored above 35% were certified in Feb 2021.

Participation: On an average 70 students did the Career preparatory students regularly. 70 hard copies of each topics were circulated and overall around 150 people had visited the web page. Though there were challenges, it was still helpful for some students to be engaged positively and learn new things.

TALENT CONTEST

Talent contest was conducted to help the participants realize that everyone has the ability in them and can utilize the opportunities, to help the participants to explore, express or excel in their creativity, and to help the participants to gain confidence and try out different things to enhance their skills.

The Theme for the Talent Contest was thought as 'My Dream Village/ City'. It was thought to help the participants to think about some development or betterment of values and infrastructure in their locality. The mobilization notice with the different contests and the criteria of evaluation with some instructions was provided in it.



About 45 Teens and Youth of 12-18 years of age from from different villages such as Eraiyur, Navalur, Vattambakkam, Vaipur, Karanaithangal, ARambakkam, Thathanur, and Gunduperumbedu had participated. The Talent Contest was conducted as follows:-Group 1 comprised of 12-14 years, Group 2 comprised of 15-17 years, and Group 3 comprised of 18 years and above.

The participants had chances to participate in Essay/ Poem Writing; Drawing/ Pencil Art; Speech/ Singing. They were given choices to submit/ present it online through Whatsapp/ Mail and offline. Some participated online and some offline. About 15 of them had participated in 2 or more contests and showcased their talents. All the participants were given certificates and best performances were rewarded separately.





YOUTH GROUPS (ACTIVE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION)

Young people are the change makers in the future society. Active small groups who think and work for the welfare of the people can make a big difference in the community. The Youth Leadership Training Program is a platform for the youth to develop themselves holistically and to influence others around them through the leadership qualities and responsibilities. The targeted age group is from primarily13years to 23years who were divided in to sub groups of 13-17 years and 18-23 years, based on the number of people and need. An ideal group is around 8-12 members.



Purpose of the Youth Groups

- Youth to become confident and responsible, by involving in the community through the utilization of time and talents.
- Youth to critically think and collaborate with one another for a positive change through innovations and problem solving.

Youth Group Activities

A training session for the youth groups in a scheduled time, monthly once, in the Leadership Development theme is conducted. Youth groups meet weekly once or two weeks once to plan and prepare for the activities with a life skill or value based topic lead by one of them in rotation for 10-15 minutes to develop their public speaking skills.

Progression and Present Scenario

We started the teens and youth meeting in various places as follows:-

ACHIEVEMENTS...

All the programs and activitieswere beneficial to the teens and youth who participated. The feedbacks and knowledge sharing by the beneficiaries are marvelous and it is the crown for all our works in the communities we are connected. The things that are created or done by some of the participants in the activities, contests and courses are mind-blowing and they had given their best out of them. Also, some of the participants started taking responsibility and initiatives

for the welfare of their community, which is marvelous and if it is continued, the dream for the self-sustaining community is in the near future. We were also able to think creatively and constructively despite all the challenges and difficulties. Also, we had become much flexible and adaptable to the situation, by moving out of the walls for regularly being connected with our beneficiaries though it might be risky and challenging.

Initially, due to the network issues, though we gave the activities, there are many contacts who could not open it and make the submissions though they had done something. Also, one to one guidance or clarifications couldn't be done properly due to the limited direct communication. Sometimes the content was heavy and some of the things couldn't be understood by the participants which needs to be taken care of in the future.

The Career preparatory course is a unique activity that we had created and we shall make some changes in it to make it little lighter and more approachable to the teens and youth. We shall continue to use it as a distant learning program for the teens and youth. Also, we may have it as a short term course for the teens and youth once things become normal after the pandemic. The personal contact with the teens and youth in their villages, at least once or twice in a month to guide them and do some good towards their community through them should be continued. More mentors and persons to guide the teens and youth as volunteers should be found out from the communities for making the things more efficient and self-sustaining.

MOVING FORWARD...

- We will pursue the Skill development, Talent building and Career development activities and programs in a more relevant and approachable manner
- We will encourage and support the teens and youth groups in the villages to think about the trainings that they need in their interested fields and try to learn it by some means
- We will support and guide the teens and youth to take initiatives and be efficient leaders for the people around them.
- We look at our Teens and Youth as,
 - Skilled, confident and responsible personalities with right values
 - Initiators of positive change by taking up opportunities
 - Contributors to the society by giving their best
 - Creators of solutions as good leaders

COVID-19 RELIEF ACTIVITIES

NEED AND REASONS FOR RELIEF

Millions of poor people in India are affected by lockdown than by Covid-19 since government announced full lockdown from 24th March 2020. After one month of complete lockdown, the government further extended the lockdown as the Covid19 cases were increasing in India and in Tamil Nadu. The government's welfare was not sufficient to some of the poor people to meet their needs for such a long period. In some places government's welfare were slowing reaching the people and some of them who don't have proper documents like Ration cards weren't able to get it.



We were able to identify more than 500 migrant workers in Eraiyur village and Local Government referred 100's of migrant workers in Vaipoor village, most of migrants were from North and Northeast India. Most of them were not able to go to work during the lockdown as well to their native places. And most of them were not able to get their salary as they were only contract workers. Sometimes the supervisors used to provide some things, but it wasn't sufficient. Even, they don't have ration cards and the supplies that are announced by the government did not reach them. We also identified some deserving tribal communities who are usually treated as least fortunate in the society belonging to schedule tribes, called Irulars. We visited about 28 families who had settled in Kundrathur and Panapakkam for more than 10 years. Most of them are daily wage laborers or contract workers and were not able to go to work because of the Lockdown. Most of them were not able to get their wages. Also, some from those community came from surrounding villages like Varanasi to cut trees in the outskirts of villages like Eraiyur and Gunduperumbedu. Because there was no public transport, most of them were stuck there itself and as they did not have ration cards in the local address, so they cannot get the materials provided by Government through ration cards. They are daily wage labourers who is paid based on the weight of wood they cut and were not able work because of the Lockdown, as the vehicles that carry the cut wood couldn't come. Though the supervisor for them supports them a bit, it was not that much sufficient for them.

In addition to all that some of the families in Padappai-Oragadam-Stretch who were without proper employment were struggling for proper food and livelihood. So, there was a need for

support for them to get proper nutritious food.

Initially, during the spread of the pandemic, people were not aware of the symptoms and the precaution measures, but slowly with the effect of media, many people got aware of Covid-19 and Corona virus

As the Covid-19 cases were still increasing in India and at the same time for supporting the livelihood of the people, government had relaxed the lockdown. But Government made it mandatory for the people to wear masks when they go out, for their safety. But not all the people were able to buy good masks.

OUR RESPONSE

Identification: We identified the deserving families in the communities that we regularly work with. And we helped some individual families from villages such as Gunduperumbedu, Perinjambakkam, Nallamperumbedu, Valathanchery, Eraiyur, Arambakkam and Navalur from April 2020 to August 2021 by distributing relief packages which contains rice, grains and groceries would support their food needs for 2 - 3 weeks. Some of the children, teens and youth from three families are directly part of our Teens & Youth programs and Community programs. We carefully did the case study with the reference and support of community leaders and staff in the larger communities and provided the relief materials distributions.



Migrant Reach Out: needs of the Migrants in Eraiyur and Vaipoor through the local revenue department authorities, our local staff and by talking to the migrants, and decided to provide some rice and provisions that would be helpful for them along with the Revenue Inspector and her team. Local Panchayat requested us to provide some relief materials to the sanitary workers in Eraiyur, who had done a tremendous job during the Lockdown to clean and put disinfectant throughout the village to prevent the spreading of Coronavirus. They worked on an honorary basis and the remuneration for them is very low. Thereby we decided to provide the relief materials for them that would be helpful for some days.

Reach Out to the unreached: Though the supplies from Government ration shops reach some of the deserving tribal communities who had settled in villages for long time, like Panapakkam and Kundrathur, they were deserving people who are in need of the other provisions. Also, there was a village called Ottangaranai in which the whole village is quarantined as there was a Covid-19 suspect and they were not able to move out of the village to get things. Thereby we decided to provide some rice and provisions that would be helpful for them for some time. Also we had found out and supported some deserving Tribal communities who didn't receive any of the welfare as they had come for cutting trees in the outskirts of Eraiyur and Gunduperumbedu. **Reach Out to Urban Slums:** Through Kumar Gold, a Vize Principal of a Chennai Catering College, who is associated with us since a long time by serving earlier as a member of the advisory board of Karunakarya Community College, as an advisor and consultant from time to time for our programs and activities, we came to know about the dire need for help in Chennai slums. The need was brought about slum dwellersof in and around Purasaiwakkam, Chennai who were suffering from lockdown and containment-zone prevention measures in their areas. There was an dire need for daily provisions for some of the slum residents and therefore wedecided to provide rice and provisions to 100 of the most deserving families in these slums. The distribution of relief packages was done in Otteri Community center on 17.-19.07.2021.

Financial Assitance: Karunakarya decided to give financial assistance to the consultants who come to the organization occasionally and work like daily wages laborers, like carpenter, electrician, and painter and also our ELC facilitators who are from deserving. Most of them were unable to work during lockdown. Karunakarya helped their families through financial relief from April to June when the lockdown was little bit severe.

Home activity for school goers: Because there was the need for the students while schools and colleges were not working properly, we distributed activity kits home wise to The Ark Nursery and Primary School children to help the children to learn without any hindrance. To help the children to use the leisure time productively during the lockdown by reading books and doing activities in activity sheets. We distributed learning materials to 228 children from 20 villages around Karunakarya.

Struggling College Student Support: We also came to know about a deserving student who was struggling to attend his online BSc in Physics classes during lockdown and also unable meet his education expectations due to the unavailability of technological facility that was expected by his department.Vikram is a brilliant and very enthusiastic student and has great potential for his future. Hence, we decided to provide him witha laptop. These study supports are mentioned and recorded in detail in the ELC report.



Awareness Efforts: In the initial stages of Covid-19 pandemic we decided to provide the awareness posters and booklets in the villages around. We gave the posters in the shops and offices and booklets to the leaders and stakeholders in the community to give to the children there and sometimes directly to the children. The booklet was appropriate for the children from 8-13 years and it was well designed colorfully with interactive activities in the theme, "You Can Bea Superhero".

You can be a Superhero - book distribution and activities:



Making and Distribution of Masks: We also decided to make the cloth masks (that can be reused) through Karuna Creations and distribute to all the families of the students who are part of The Ark Nursery and Primary School, Evening Learning Centers and Teens & Youth programs. We also distributed the masks in Gunduperumbedu and Eraiyur Tribal communities, Sanitary workers in Eraiyur and Navalur. We also provided the masks to our Karunakarya staff, Consultants and their family. Each member of the family was given two masks. The masks were packed hygienically with Standard Operating Procedures and were distributed from May 2020 to January 2021. This was helpful for many of them to keep themselves safe in this pandemic period.

LEARNINGS FOR THE FUTURE

• The relief work during the crisis of lockdown helped us to get to know about some of the least privileged people in the community whom we rarely thought of. We met many new people who are much deserving and supported them. It created pathways to work with them in the future for their development and sustenance.

• Mask making activity by ourselves through Karuna Creations was achieved though it was a very new product. The beautiful masks made by us were utilized by our own staff, beneficiaries and the deserving people in the communities we work with. By being flexible and adaptable to the different situations we were able to be beneficial to the people around.

• Only when we moved and reached so many villages for the Coronavirus Awareness Posters and Booklets distribution we realised the great scope and the need in many villages for the development of Children, Youth and Communities. Though the Posters and Booklets it was really possible to make some difference and give light to those who are in complete ignorance. We plan to continue to make awareness posters and booklets on topics such as De-addiction, Using Media Effectively and safely, Importance of Education, Creativity, etc. to create awareness and exposure at a larger scale.

• Values like respect for all, integrity, fairness and equality will continue to build us effectively and serve the people around us meaningfully.

We Karunakarya, always welcome the volunteers and interns who wish to learn and practice social work. When the MCC Department of Social work approached us for helping their 9 students to practice social work principles and concepts as well as gain the necessary skills and knowledge practically through virtual social work practice in August (24 hours) and virtual field work from September to November (120 hours), we welcomed them.

Madras Christian College (MCC) is a liberal arts and sciences college in Chennai, India. Founded in 1837, MCC is one of Asia's oldest extant colleges. The college is affiliated to the University of Madras but functions as an autonomous institution from its main campus in Tambaram, Chennai. The Department of Social Work congruent with the Mission of Madras Christian College offers Human Rights and Value based Professional Social work education as a vocation of service through building of character, experiencing transformational development and acquiring critical consciousness in order to empower people to promote an egalitarian and just society.

On 30/9/20, the MCC students started their group work virtually via Google meet with our ELC students from Navalur and Gunduperumbedu, in which about 14 students participated. It was continued till December 2020. The sessions were conducted on 28/10/20, 6/11/20 and 3/12/2020. Overall around 20 participants got benefited through the group work.

KARUNA CREATIONS

Karunakarya Creations is a unique project which supports women and acts as a catalyst which trains women in the community to become self-employed, and to help them become financially independent. The project also provides a place for rehabilitation and a safe working environment for people with mental and physical disabilities, and people who come from abusive domestic environments.

Objectives

- Providing a safe training and work environment, as well as rehabilitation for those people who require it.
- Creating a platform for training for people to discover and develop their potential. Trainees are given a source of income as compensation and a contribution towards their financial independence, teaching entrepreneurship and self-sustainability.
- Develop the community by strengthening the potential of integrated beneficiaries through various projects.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES DURING THE COVID19 PANDEMIC

In the year 2020 to 2021 the project was interrupted by the COVID19 pandemic which led into a lockdown and complete shut down of productive activities. In April - May 2020 Mrs. Chellappa has responded to the pandemic situation by developing4 suitable face mask models to cater to the urgent need for protective of the disease. This brought an opportunity for women of the nearby communities to join the urgent need and help to sustain their families during the lockdown period.

After a week of training of 6 ladies, the unit of Karuna Creations was given free of cost for the purpose of training, preparation, work distribution & collection, packing and distribution. This activity was permitted by the Government of Tamil Nadu. The total of Masks produced were 3800 which got distributed free of cost to all beneficiaries of Karunakarya and their families, sanitary workers of several villages and other deserving groups of beneficiaries which were met during the relief work efforts.

The project was functioning from May to December 2020 under the Karunakarya Relief-Projects. Further details are recorded in the respective report.



OUR BEAD ARTIST ATELIER

During the last couple of years **Vetrivel**, who is associated with us for more than 12 years, has developed a special skill for bead art and has tried many different patterns. He specializes in twisting wires and assembling beads to create beautiful and colorful butterflies of various designs, sizes and decorations.

While dealing with the drawbacks of a genetical disease, he has become an artist, though sometimes not believing in his skill, he always overcomes challenges to create something new and beautiful!

His eyes will shine with joy when we like his designs. During the year 2020 he made many little butterflygifts which literally flew into the whole world to bring a small reflection of Karunakarya to sponsors and wellwishers of the organization.



CONCLUSION

During the time of restrictions due to the pandemic, the projects of Karunakarya Creation offered opportunities for people from the community to sustain during this difficult time. In future, whenever the situation of pandemic allows it again, we would be looking at enhancing opportunities according to our objectives to empower people from the community.
